

History Of Rooty Hill



The earliest exploration of the area was led by Captain Watkin Tench in 1789. The origin of the "Rooty Hill" name puzzled historians for many years because the clue lay not in the Blacktown City but on Norfolk Island. Governor Philip Gidley King had been in charge of the first settlement on Norfolk Island in early 1788 and had noted that the hillside where he had built his government house had been difficult to dig, owing to the amount of tree roots beneath the surface. The hill on Norfolk became known as the 'rooty hill' and the name is now official. When Governor King returned to NSW he built the headquarters for his government reserve of 1802 at the foot of a hill that reminded him of the Norfolk Island rooty hill .There can be very little doubt that he named Blacktown's Rooty Hill after that on Norfolk Island where he had met his future wife .The name Rooty Hill first appeared on a map in 1803.


